RESOLUTION

Government has directed that the existing departmental examination rules, both for continuance and confirmation and also for qualifying for promotion to higher posts, should be suitably amended so as to provide therein for the grant of exemption from passing the departmental examination on attaining the age of 45 years by the concerned Government servant, subject to the condition that the seniority if lost by such a Government servant as a result of not passing the departmental examination within the prescribed time limit and the number of chances permissible shall not be restored on granting such exemption.

2. In the subordinate revenue services following Departmental Examinations have been prescribed for non gazetted revenue subordinates for confirmation and/or promotion to higher post:-

Bombay Collectorate:- Revenue Departmental Examination.

Bombay and Pune Division:- Sub service Departmental examination for Talathis.
Sub service Departmental Examination for Clerks.
Revenue Qualifying Examination.

Aurangabad Division:- Revenue Clerks' Departmental Examination.
Revenue Officers' Examination.

Nagpur Division:- Departmental Examination for Revenue Officers.

3. In conformance with the Government decision referred to in para 1 above, Government is pleased to direct that all Class III Government Servants in the subordinate revenue services should be deemed to have been exempted from the conditions of passing the respective Departmental Examination prescribed for continuance, confirmation and also for qualifying for promotion to higher post on attaining the age of 45 years. The exemption should be subject to the condition that the seniority, if lost by such Government servant as a result of not passing the Departmental Examination within the prescribed time limit and the number of chances permissible should not be restored on granting such exemption.

4. These orders should take retrospective effect from 1st November 1977, i.e. the date as issue of G.A.D. order.

5. Necessary amendment to the respective departmental examination rules will be issued separately.
